Acclaimed authors Jane Vandenburgh (2010, winter 2013) and Heidi Durrow (2005, 2013) started the year coaching participants through the complexities of writing their novels. Before

the first group of resident artists arrive in April, noted writer **Ann Fisher-Wirth** (1996) will be guiding artists in the process of memoir and nature writing. And San Francisco media artist **Ian Winters** (2013) will host a group to explore sound and media installations. The creative spirit is busting out all over.

Preserving the redwood forests and coastal grasslands is a critical part of our mission as well. I am pleased to say that, once again, ALL of our public hikes are "sold-out," and a few spots remain for my Director's Hikes. I want to thank our stalwart crew of trail docents for their work.
