Collaborative Chemistry

Kander and Ebb, Simon and Garfunkel, Ginger and Fred... Collaborations don't just spontaneously generate. They are the result of a delicate combination of talent, time and trust. And a willingness to take risks. Djerassi Resident Artists Program - with no required work outcomes for our

residents - is devoted to the artistic building blocks that generate collaborations. Sometimes we are the petri dish, sometimes the incubator, sometimes the lab for artistic trial and error. The bottom line? What happens on the mountain doesn't stay on the mountain - the relationships with art and people that are created here reverberate through a worldwide cultural landscape.

Utterback and Foehringer, Abraham and Wise, Tromble and Sumner, Conrad and Vikram. You may not recognize Camille & Mark, Ralph & Nina, Meredith & Dawn, Cummings & Seth. Yet. But the collaborative fires sparked here among these 8 residents alone have resulted in the world premiere of Dances of the

Sacred and Profane at Ft. Mason's Cowell Theatre, the on-going success of *The Kepler Story*, a new sculpture AND visualized dream installations AND a groundbreaking opera, *The Golden Gate*, drawn from a groundbreaking book in verse. What's more, Conrad Cummings and Vikram Seth have a new collaboration: *Two Premiers and a Reunion* at the National Opera Center in New York. In a more commercialized enterprise we would be shouting, "The hits keep on coming." (See *Comings & Goings* for details).

By and large, artists arrive at the Artists' Ranch alone. They travel to do THEIR work - to focus on their own individual muse. We often say we support the *individual* artist. But then the Djerassi Magic takes hold. And one becomes two. And sometimes two become three. Before you know it, the composer is in the media arts studio and the poet is in the choreography studio.

"Will you won't you, will you won't you, won't you join the dance?" cries Lewis Carroll's mock turtle. Djerassi news

SOUTH from Alaska - our first Rasmuson Foundation fellow has arrived: playwright Arlitia Jones. In an exchange program, our new northern partners nominate candidates to come to artist residences in the 'lower 48' while residences down here nominate artists for a stay at the Island Institute in Sitka. This year our Djerassi alum nominee, playwright **Dipika Guha** (2012), was invited for a 60-day residency in Sitka.

Sarah FitzSimons (2014) has graced the Artists' Ranch with an impressive sculpture entitled *House*, set high above our mountain retreat (see picture). The structure represents a similar footprint and profile of a 3000 sq. ft. house. In the spirit of keeping our works 'ephemeral' the sculpture will remain in place only a few months. Hopefully our high winds and winter storms won't take the house down before Sarah comes back from Madison, Wisconsin in January to deconstruct and retrieve the piece.

All's Fair, they say. The Art Silicon Valley/SF Arts Fair that is. October 9-12 at the Expo Hall in San Mateo, CA. We have a new partnership with this event which includes VIP passes and other benefits. The Fair features many international galleries as well as a commitment to support LOCAL cultural organizations such as Zero 1 and Djerassi. Although we at the Ranch will be preoccupied with Artful Harvest that weekend, anyone interested in attending should start by reading all about the event here.

Taylor Ho Bynum (2013) has embarked on his Acoustic Bicycle Tour. Taylor writes, "In a lifetime of unusual artistic choices, this may be the craziest - playing gigs all along the West Coast from Canada to Mexico, traveling only by bike with my cornet strapped onboard."

Ben Hjertman (2013) was featured in the *Memphis Flyer* online. To quote: "The most interesting composer in the mix might be **Ben Hjertmann**, who has challenged the norms of composition at their core. His piece 'Donkey Rhubarb' was crowdsourced through voting software on his blog. Students from dozens of music programs made decisions on everything from the title to the opening theme. Hjertmann completed his Ph.D. at Northwestern in June 2013 studying microtonal harmonic structures, which are the spaces between the notes in a scale. He also heads the "avant-pop" band Kong Must Dead." Read more

Laura Konjetzky (2013), performed a solo piano recital of NIGHT-TIME & the world premiere of her compositions, Nocturne 3 and Nocturne 5 at Oberpfälzer Künstlerhaus in Schwandorf, Germany, on September 5. Camille Utterback (2012) is proud to be one of three finalists, along with Leo Villareal and Jennifer Steinkamp, for the Moscone Expansion Project, a large public art project in San Francisco.

The San Francisco Arts Commission put out an RFQ looking for projects that will create an iconic sense of arrival to enhance Moscone's civic presence on Howard Street, reconnecting it to the surrounding neighborhood. The project proposes a new enclosed pedestrian bridge connecting the upper levels of the new Moscone North and Moscone South as the primary art enrichment site and is looking for an artwork that utilizes light to transform the architectural space.

The three proposals will be on display for public comment in October (exact date tbd). Follow Camille's <u>Facebook page</u> for up-to-date information on where and when to view the proposals.

Camille is also in a project with **Mark Foehringer** (2012) and his dance company in a collaboration that began when they were residents at Djerassi. See more about their upcoming performance to reopen the Cowell Theatre at Fort Mason in *Comings & Goings*.
